

Application Information for EJU Preparation Course

Purpose:

The courses provide those who want to learn Japanese intensively, and to go to the university or college in Japan, after graduation. Levels are separated into Basic, Lower Intermediate, Higher Intermediate and Advanced levels. A comprehensive approach to speaking, listening, reading, and writing allows these 4 skills to improve together.

Class hours:

There are four lessons in one day in the morning session or afternoon session, and each lesson is 50-minutes length. Level check tests will be conducted to determine class placement. With a holiday-system of Saturdays/Sundays, public/summer/term-end holidays, and holidays set by the headmaster.

◆ Cost of teaching materials differs according to the level.

◆* You can make an application for paying by installments with a 6-monthes tuition fee.

◆ Dormitory fee: The dormitory fee will be demanded together with the tuition fee which is 60000 yen for the commission. Monthly rent depends upon the room type: 25,000 yen for twin, 40,000 yen for single.

◆ Application fee is non-returnable. After the announcement of selection result, school entrance fee is non-returnable.

General Requirements:

1. High school diplomas (12 years)or equivalent (if you want to go for further education after graduation)
2. Physically, mentally and economically fit.
3. Within five years from the last educational graduation.

Selection based on your records

Secondary selection carried out if necessary (incl. Interview and exams)

5	Certificate Of studying Japanese	More than 150 hours at any Japanese school.
6	Copy of passport	If you have one or previously been in Japan.
7	The certificate of relationship between the applicant and the sponsor	The original family registers or birth certificates to show the relationship between the applicant and the sponsor.

<Documents concerning the person bearing study and living expenses (sponsor)>

1	Guarantee for Bearing Study and Living Expenses	<p>*Original form *hand written by sponsor.</p> <p>*Write the correct address and telephone No. of your family.</p> <p>*The amount provided by the sponsors cannot be less than 1,500,000 Japanese Yen.</p>
2	Bank balance certificate	More than the equivalent of 1,500,000 Japanese Yen
3	Certificate of Employment	The tenure-of-office certificate with which the income was indicated.
4	Income/Tax Certificate	Documentation specifying the payer's income of the last three years.
5	Others We will contact you according to your details.	<p>Something else will be demanded due to the type of the sponsor's income, such as business license certificate is required for an individual proprietor.</p> <p>Copy of bank note if you have.</p> <p>Copy of sponsor's family register if you have.</p>

Special Notes:

- (1) If you apply through a proxy in Japan, the proxy will be asked to come to NJA directly.
- (2) Except for the original diploma, NO paperwork will be returned back to the applicant. If there are any documents that have to be returned, please tell us when you apply.
- (3) If you submit a copied document, please make it A4 size. And on all copies, you have to state the date of copied, the name who copied, and the relationship between applicant and the person who copied.
- (4) All paperwork must be officially translated into Japanese. (Handwritten translation will not be accepted).
- (5) Please submit the certificate with the address and phone number of the publisher.
- (6) When you submit a certificate translated into English, please submit it with the original.
